St. Joseph High School does not rank its students for the college admissions process, except as required by the "Texas Top 10% Rule"(HB 588).

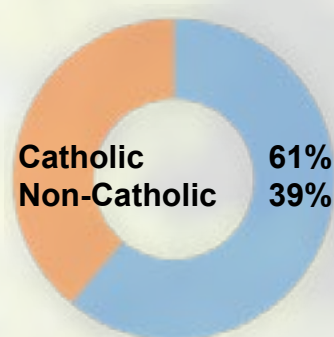
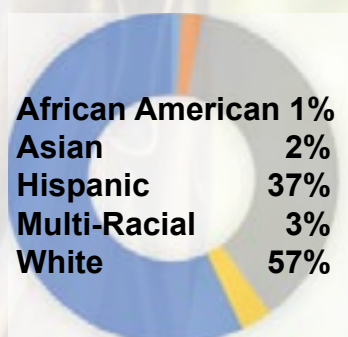
ACCREDITATION

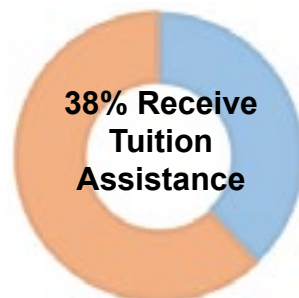
Grading Structure

The scholastic year is divided into four quarters. Each semester grade is calculated on 40% per quarter average and 20% per exam grade. A 100% GPA scale is used. Averages are weighted by adding 6 points to Honors courses and 8 points to AP and Dual Credit courses in the cumulative GPA calculation. The grading scale is as follows:

For the 2024-25 school year, St. Joseph High School awarded more than \$343,025 in need-based financial aid to 38% of our students.



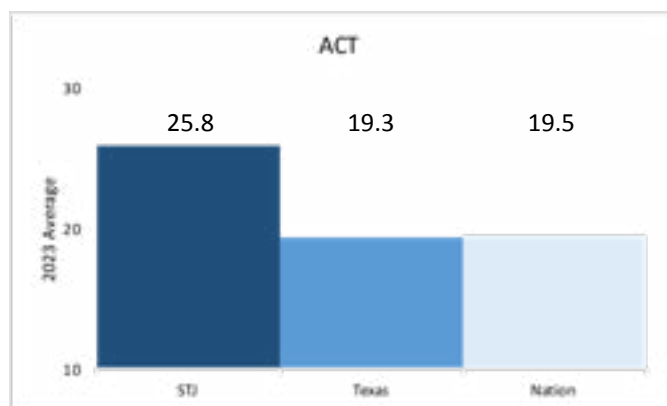
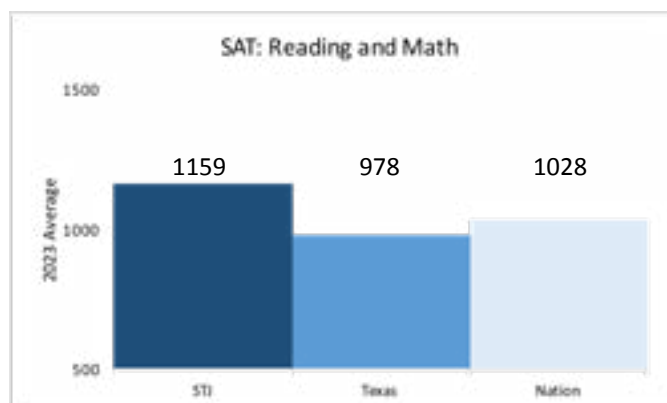
